Wisconsin's Endangered Flora

Wisconsin is home to over 3,200 taxa (species, subspecies, varieties and hybrids) of plants, including six federally threatened species, and over 130 state threatened or endangered species. Many of Wisconsin's rarest and most vulnerable plants are harbored within protected lands including State Natural Areas.

Wisconsin's plants are threatened by habitat loss and competition from invasive species, and funding is needed to assist the DNR and other partners in the restoration, monitoring, inventorying and preservation of our plant diversity.
